SUBJ: Story on "Super Joe"

"Super Joe" has kept 'the fire burning', on, "The Search for... the 'New' King of the Stuntmen". "Super Joe" has performed some of the World's most dangerous motorcycle leaps in history, in the tradition of Evel Knievel. One of Joe's jumps had Evel say: "That's the best stunt I've see in 15 years!" (Since Evel retired.) The jump Evel spoke of: "Super Joe" trained a partner to jump side-by-side with him, off the top of a six story building, (at over 60 m.p.h.) in downtown Las Vegas, across a multi-lane city street (a 100-ft. 'gap' between the buildings), and land on another six story building, safely!

There are stunts even more unusual and "spectacular" than that!

"Super Joe" talks about and remembers stunt/jumps like:

- ♦ 1983 A world record breaking motorcycle (M/C) jump over the whirling (steel) blades of 3-full-size helicopters! The previous record was 2-"choppers", ramp-to-ramp. Joe accomplished his record jumping ramp-to-ground!, (without the aid of a landing ramp), traveling at over 90 miles per hour (m.p.h.), off a custom built 63 ft. long, 14 ft. high 'take-off' ramp, Joe cleared 'the blades' of the third helicopter, by less than a foot, (less than 12 inches). This record (still) stands to this day, for jumping 146 ft. through the air, over these obstacles, ('active' helicopters, lined-up side-by-side).
- 1988 The highest, and farthest motorcycle jump(s) on record. 2-Building-to-building jumps. Again, World Records. Unchallenged to this day. First jump, performed solo, by one of Joe's "Team SuperStunts" 'crime fighting' members, known as "The Bandit." Second jump performing with "The Guardian." What it took to 'dream up', engineer and execute this most 'original' and very death defying stunt.
- ♦ 1996 What it felt like, to perform the World's first "Blindfolded" (vehicular) motorcycle jump in entertainment history. Jumping at about 40 m.p.h., off a 'take-off' ramp 10 feet high, "Super Joe" flew through the 'night air', through a 'ring of fire', "blindfolded!" Guided to the 'take-off' ramp, by a voice through a radio communicator on Joe's helmet. With the 'take-off' ramp only 4 feet wide, "Super Joe" hit his target, 'dead center!", as he jumped the 30 foot gap between the ramps, "blindfolded!" (Jump performed on: 4-13-96)
- ♦ 1996 An earth ramp-to-earth ramp jump over the whirling blades of 4 "Ritter" fans! (Wind machines used in the motion picture "Twister"), with one arm tied behind his back! With the top (protective) cages removed, blades exposed, "Super Joe" falls short, and lands into 'the blades!... And walks away unhurt! Why? Because he's "Super Joe!" Listen to Joe's stories of how it felt, before, during and after this 'weird' jump, (jumping with one arm, directly over "Ritter Blades"). (Jump performed on: 5-26-96) "Super Joe" actually 'crashes' on this attempt. Falling 10-to-15 feet "short", landing into 'The Blades!' and the outcome... "Super Joe walks away, unhurt.
- 1998 Breaking the record for the highest motorcycle jump(s). Guinness World Record for the highest building-to-building jump, performed at night in Downtown Los Angeles, twice! First performed by "Super Joe" Reed, then performed my "Super Joe's" teammate "Jumpin Jamie" Pamintuan, the first building-to-building jump, in history, to be performed by a female!
- <u>1999</u> Set 'multiple' world records, in one jump. 1 & 2 becoming the only 'fathe-and-son' team to jump together, ramp-to-ramp... while "blindfolded!!!" 2. The youngest (paid) professional daredevil in history. "Super Joey" Reed was 5-years old when he made the jump with his "Super Dad."

• <u>2000</u> Setting yet another world record, with a new and very dangerous twist to an old standard... 'Bungee jumping'.
"Super Joe" creates and 'executes' (pardon the pun) "The Bungee Jump from Hell!" 'Joe' attaches a 200 foot long bungee cord to his feet, and jumps out of an airborne helicopter. Estimating/projecting the rebound/recoil distance length of the cord, he performs the jump directly over the 'whirling blades' of another helicopter on the ground. His head & body coming approximately 20 feet from 'the blades.' (This is the only time in history the 'original' stunt has been attempted. 'Joe' has performed 'it' 3-times.) And 'we' have the only female to perform the stunt. 'Joe's' protégé, Jumpin' Jamie Pamintuan. She jumped 2 times. And 1-additional male jumper part of the bungee engineering crew, Dan Watson.

'We' own 'the rights' to all of these stunts. Interviews, background, support material exists on all stunts.

Additionally

- 1997 The world's smallest motorcycle, a one-eighth size 50cc 'pocket-bike', is jumped by 'Super Joe', ramp-to-ramp, while "blindfolded", through a "ring of fire!" Jumpin' Jamie P. jumps for the record distance, with vision. 19 feet, ramp-to-ground. She jumped over the landing ramp.
- 1997 The first 'team' jump (male & female), jumping ramp-to-ramp, while the rider/driver is totally "blindfolded." 'They' follow directions, to the (4-foot wide) take off ramp, through a radio communicator inside the helmet. (3-separate 'blindfolds' are placed over goggles, with spectators pulled from the audience, observing placement. To validate 'blindfolding.') "Super Joe" and "Jumpin' Jamie" crash on a first attempt. Get up, dust themselves off, spread the ramps apart some more. And then successfully perform 'the only', team 'blind' jump in history.
- <u>1997</u> "Super Joe" jumps a 'new' record distance, solo, "blindfolded." 57 feet through the air, in a 35 MPH cross-wind! 'Jamie' jumps over and in between airborne acrobats jumping up/into her 'flight path,' off a huge trampoline.
- 1997 'Joe' jumps incognito, and 'blind' again. This time, he designs and constructs a giant (7 foot long/5 foot high) football, attached to a frame and a 60cc mini-dirt bike. Jumping off a 6 foot high ramp through a make-shift goal post for the KLOS/Mark and Brian's "What would you do for Super Bowl Tickets". winning the grand prize of a trip to the 1998 Super Bowl.
- <u>2001</u> **"24-in-24"!** December 19th & 20th, 2001, "Super Joe" Reed, "Jumpin' Jamie" Pamintuan and "Holeshot Heidi" Henry set 24, 'new', world motorcycle jumping records, in less than 24-hours! (See-detailed 'List of Records', that follows this summary list, with photos/video stills.)

These records represent 'the first' and 'only' time that (a) motorcyclist(s) have ever attempted to jump "directly over 'the blades' of an 'airborne' helicopter! (And 'we', did this 5-times, in-a-row, in different 'flight paths', formations, and combinations. With 1, 2, and 3 jumpers flying at one-time, in a "criss-cross" pattern, over the Jet Ranger helicopter.

• <u>2002</u> 'Creating' a 'new' short-distance motorcycle jumping record, with special effects added-in for good measure. He sets-up a ramp-to-ramp jump, 3-foot wide take-off ramp, and a 3-foot wide landing ramp, 'Super Joe' jumps over the landing ramp, for a distance of 41 feet, jumping though a 'ring of fire', totally "blindfolded", and, with his (back) body set on fire!, with only a voice through a radio communicator in his helmet, for directions to the 'take-off' ramp. (This time, 'the voice' was that of his wife, Jennifer Reed. Her first time in 'the act.')
