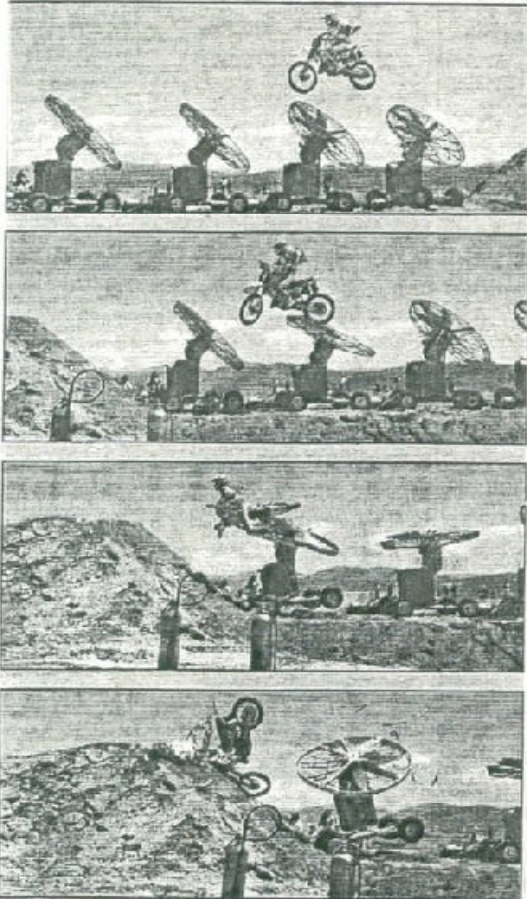


Bike meets blade

Stuntman Joe Reed fell short of jumping four propeller-driven wind machines Sunday at L.A. County Raceway. Reed, who made the jump with one hand tied behind his back, was thrown over his handlebars and into the side of the ramp after his motorcycle hit the third wind machine. Reed wasn't hurt in the accident.



The World's First "Blindfolded" (vehicular) motorcycle jump!

Ramps designed and constructed by Frank Scarpine and Carey Seelley. "Super Joe" Reed (while "blindfolded") was guided to the take-off ramp, only, by the voice of Carey Seelley, through a radio communicator, "Joe's" Safety Crew Chief. Ramps were 10 feet high, 30 feet apart. Take-off ramp was only 4 feet wide. Take-off jump speed, 40 m.p.h.
